Winners will be announced at the November 12th Night Meeting.



- *All sellers will need to work a 2-hour shift in this area.
- *Seller will price their own items.
- *10 percent of sales go to supporting future PPQG quilt shows & symposiums.

Vendor Space is a place where one can sell items you have made or sewing/craft related items.

- *Not limited to Guild members.
- *6' space rents for \$25 and a 10' x 10' space rents for \$50.

Calling ALL quilters!

This is an opportunity for quilters to participate in the recovery assistance for those affected by Hurricane Helene while sharing our love of quilting and the warmth, comfort and beauty a quilt can bring into a person's life.

Hurricane Helene Comfort Quilts SW Virginia, Kentucky, and NW North Carolina

Hello fellow quilters:

Les and Tammy Wallace here with Stitched Memories, LLC.

We are reaching out to our quilting community to request your help in making Comfort Quilts for those in South-west Virginia, Kentucky and northwest North Carolina that were affected by Hurricane Helene.

This is not an overnight response; however, with the cold weather approaching and holidays only 12 weeks away it would be a very appropriate time to let those affected by the storm know that they are not forgotten. **Our goal is to collect as many quilts as possible by December 1** to reach those who were displaced from their homes during the floods by the storm. Our focus is on the young and elderly in hard-to-reach locations. We are working on details to get the quilts to the affected area(s) and will provide more information when available.

The Comfort Quilts recommended sizes; small 40 x 50 inches, medium 50 x 70 inches and large 60 x 80 inches. We currently do not have funding so we are asking that you dig into your stash and be simple and creative. Nine Patch quilts or jelly rolls are fine.

We are reaching across Virginia and Kentucky to establish drop-off locations closer to you, where you can drop off or send completed quilts.

If you are a topper or a longarmer, please complete the sign-up form (linked below) so we can coordinate support. We ask toppers to provide backing with your tops if possible. Backing should be eight inches longer and eight inches wider than your quilt top to be able to accommodate it on a longarm machine.

Crossed Canoes, by David Sirota

A precision method to bring 12 pieces of fabric into a single point!

Paper piecing can be a quilter's challenge. There are so many ways to get it wrong, right? Wrong! I've taken the mystery out of paper piecing by making it easy to do and much faster and efficient. But you'll have to be the judge of that. The actual "Crossed Canoes" block is quite simple. But the quilt top assembly needs to be precise. This quilt isn't about the paper piecing, since all of the blocks are identical except for color. The fun part is putting the blocks together. We'll be using a different method for precision where TWELVE pieces of fabric come together into a single point. So get out your floss and let's go canoeing.

PPQG Day Chapter Meeting Minutes, October 11, 2024

Day Coordinator Terry Payne opened the meeting at 10:00 a.m.

Attendance: 57 members, 2 guests

Meeting Minutes for September were reviewed. Natalie Hutchinson motioned for approval Nancy ShROUT seconded the motion. General Membership vote approved the motion.

Treasurer's Report for August was found to have a \$100 shortage. This was discovered by Patty Swan, also motioning for the correction to be reflected in the September Treasurer's Report. Gina Vivian previously completed an audit. Jeanne Surber motioned for acceptance; Marilyn Riveria seconded the motion. The At-Large Vote was unanimous to accept.

Announcements

- ◆ Showed a quilt pattern that was available on the Free Table. A large box of this pattern was recovered from the Guild Storage Shed. Copies are free to all members.
- ◆ Mid-Atlantic Registration is now open. See the Mancuso website for registration information.

- ◆ Thank you to Susan Waddles and Candy Byrd for support at PPQG's Fall-O-Ween Booth.
- ◆ The Night Meeting Secretary has been secured: Trish Emerson.
- ◆ Budgets for 2025 are now under review and discussion.
- ◆ Mid-Atlantic Raffle Quilt: For PPQG to have a Raffle Quilt, 32-hours of White Glove Service must be supported. Two-hour shifts per person will be scheduled. Volunteers are also needed to man the PPQG table displaying the raffle quilt and collect ticket money. Kits for the quilt blocks are being put together by Sandy Barnes, with Debbie Moore and Susan Waddles also helping. Natalie Hutchinson will sew the finished blocks together for the top. Batting has been donated by Jeanne Surber. Marilyn Rivera has enough backing fabric to donate. Jeanne Surber will do the long-arm work. Pat Sappenfield will do the binding. The finished size will be "80.5" x "92".

Birthdays October Birthday Fat Quarters were provided by Terry Payne to nine members.

Quilts of Valor: Susan Anthony spoke of a combined coordination for Comfort Quilt Donations to North Carolina Hurricane Recovery. By December 1st all quilt donations should be taken to Sunshine Quilt Shop in Newport News, Fabric Hunt in Norfolk, or Different Touch in Chesapeake. All help is welcome for this quilting charity donation.

Karen Carr spoke of the PPQG Challenge Quilt. The group of quilts will be displayed at Mid Atlantic. A vote will take place next month at the November meetings.

Jeanne Surber announced that both November Guild meetings will meet in the Sanctuary.

Calie Mowery described the availability of the free table and simple guidelines for its use. Calie also announced the Peninsula Angel Quilts Fund Raising Social Day for October will be held on Monday, October 14. This is an open invitation for anyone to participate with the group. Suggested Donation amount is \$20 for the full day – 8 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Both can be pinned, but it is recommended to have it sewn.

- ◆ ALL Sales can only be paid by Cash or Checks. No electronic transactions will be available.

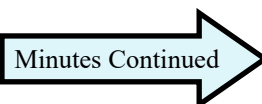
