- Quilts will be displayed and voted on at November Day and Night meetings, with winners announced at the Nov. 12 Night Meeting.
- All quilts will be eligible to be displayed at Mid Atlantic Quilt Show, if you so desire

Small Service Project donations support the following initiatives:

- Lap/wheel chair size quilts or throw size quilts go to end-of-life comfort care patients at Riverside Hospital. These can be lap/wheel chair or throw size quilts for both men and women.
- Baby quilts and fabric hearts go to Riverside and CHKD NICU. Fabric hearts can be made of cotton, flannel or both. If you need the pattern or a template, please let us know.

Suggested sizes for quilts are 30" x 40" baby quilts, 36" x 56" crib quilts and 50" x 65" throw quilts, but we accept any size small quilts for these projects.

Please help PPQG support these causes by turning donations in to Shonda Berry or Peggy Taylor. If you have suggestions for any other organizations that would benefit from small service projects, let us know.

Quilt Show Information

The Quilt Show Committee wishes to clarify the difference between the two types of sale areas.

Member Sales area is a place where members can sell fabric, sewing supplies, and craft supplies.

- *Limited to Guild Members only.
- *All sellers will need to work a 2-hour shift in this area.
- *Seller will price their own items.
- *10 percent of sales go to supporting future PPQG quilt shows & symposiums.
- *Please see Amy Mazich for more information.

<u>Vendor Space</u> is a place where one can sell items you have made or sewing/craft related items.

- *Not limited to Guild members.
- *6' space rents for \$25 and a 10' x 10' space rents for \$50.
- *Vendors supply their own table(s).
- *Vendor staffs their table throughout the two day show.
- *Items must be sewing or craft related. No Pampered Chef or Tupperware vendors.
- *Can share a vendor space 2 or 3 ways with other people.
- *Please see Calie Mowery for applications.

Please note that the Quilt Show (QS) is self-supporting. Money from vendor spaces, car show entries, etc., will pay for venue rental and other QS expenses. Surplus income will go to supporting future PPQG quilt shows & symposiums.

Guidelines for Sellers in the Member Sales Area

- 1. You must be a current Guild Member.
- 2. You must agree to volunteer for AT LEAST one 2-hour shift in our sales area during the show. (sign-up sheet for this will become available in **October**)
- 3. Only quilting, sewing, knitting and needlework related items in clean, usable condition may be sold.
 - **Exceptions: No Quilts or Sewing Machines will be accepted and we reserve the right to refuse items deemed inappropriate for sale.
- 4. The *Guidelines for Submitting Items for Sale* form is available on the website at 2024 Quilts and Car Show in the area under Forms. Click on Sales Rules, then print the form. It must be filled out and turned in to us at the September Guild meetings.
- 5. A *Sale Items Inventory Sheet* will be available on the Guild Website soon. A copy of this sheet or sheets on which you list your items for sale and prices must be turned in to us NLT the October meetings, at which time you will be given the price tags to use. Please make a copy of your completed *Sales Items Inventory Sheet* for yourself—we will not return the one(s) you turn in.
- 6. Your items must be brought to Poquoson HS and set up in our area on **Friday, November**15 between 3:30 pm and 6:00 pm. Plan to contain your items for neat, compact display, i.e., fabric yardage marked and in clear plastic bags, containers for books, patterns, etc.
- 7. Any unsold items must be collected by **Sunday**, **November 17 by 5:30 pm** after the close of the show.
